

**TOWN OF SOUTHLINGTON  
PARKING AUTHORITY  
REGULAR MEETING  
DECEMBER 4, 2008**

The regular meeting of the Parking Authority of the town of Southington was held on December 4, 2008 in the Council Chambers of the Southington Town Hall, 75 Main Street, Southington, CT. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson, Rebecca Davis at 4:34PM.

**Pledge of Allegiance**

The Pledge of allegiance to the American Flag was recited by everyone in attendance.

**Roll Call**

Present at roll call: Mr. Salmeri, Ms. Zommer, Ms. Davis and Ms. Babkirk.

A quorum is determined.

**Rebecca Davis, assuming the Chair:**

Mr. Salmeri made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 6, 2008 meeting and the Public Hearing of November 20, 2008. Ms. Zommer seconded the motion and it passed on a voice vote.

**Police Communications**

None.

**Public Communications**

None. Ms. Babkirk asked if it was not routine to have public input from the floor. Ms. Davis explained that it was not usual, unless there was an issue on the agenda that prompted the attention of citizens.

**Commissioners' Communications**

Ms. Davis reported that she had submitted a legal notice to the newspaper announcing the additional two hour parking in the Fleet Lot. The newspaper has not provided an affidavit of public notice yet. It is important to officially document that exact date, since new regulations cannot be enforced until 20 days from public notice.

The chair also notified Chief Daley by letter, that the Parking Authority had voted to increase parking fines from \$10 to \$25. He will present this to the Police Commission. If it is approved there, it will be presented at the Town Council.

### **Submission of Bills and Payments**

Ms. Zommer made a motion to pay the stenographer \$106. Mr. Salmeri seconded her motion and it passed on a voice vote.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

None.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### Budget

The proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal year was reviewed and explained in-depth for the benefit of the new commissioner. Proposed budget stands at \$26,050. The Chair asked for commissioner's thoughts on the budget.

Ms. Davis feels that this budget will probably not be increased.

Mr. Salmeri spoke about the varied responsibilities of this commission to oversee and maintain the municipal parking lots. Although he admits that economic times warrant restraint, there are some expansion projects in the works and he does not feel that this funding will suffice as responsibilities are increased. Mr. Salmeri discussed the need for a parking study even though the Council does not acknowledge the value of it. He feels very strongly that an updated parking study is necessary to properly assess long-term parking needs and make appropriate plans for future downtown development.

Ms. Davis explained to Ms. Babkirk that there were some great ideas gleaned from the round table meeting that was held recently with department heads and other commissions surrounding the parking study issue. Previous minutes reflect them.

Mr. Salmeri also said that any action considered absolutely must be enforceable to be worthwhile. Enforcement is expensive and should the police department find that it is unable to handle the volume of infraction in the parking lots, the Parking Authority may at some point need to consider hiring an enforcement officer. This expense is not addressed in this proposed budget.

Ms. Zommer offered that she foresees "pay for parking" downtown, as the lots become stretched to their limit to provide spaces, in order to subsidize the expense of maintaining and expanding municipal lots for the fair and equitable use of all.

Mr. Salmeri recalled that this commission has discussed in the past, a cost for waivers plan in order to fund the business of the Parking Authority.

Ms. Babkirk asked about the parking study issue. Mr. Salmeri and Ms. Davis explained at some length their views

on the necessity for a professional study and the fact that the expense for this is just not authorized. Mr. Salmeri brought up the savings of \$25,000 on the paving of a municipal lot, which would have funded a parking study if the parking authority had been allowed to reallocate that savings. This was not allowed. He explained that the goal of this commission is to use its budget funds wisely and to the best advantage of the Town.

Ms. Babkirk questioned them about the cost involved and she was told that a request for \$25,000 had been made through the town planner and not approved. Mr. Salmeri reminded all that this commission makes decisions for the good the town and he felt that a professional parking study would help this commission of volunteers, with varied experience, to make sound decisions concerning management of municipal lots, form a viable long term plan and not ultimately overspend the Town's money. Mr. Salmeri explained that decisions are made here every month that affect many citizens and it is necessary that these decisions be made on factual information, not based on personal agenda or emotional issues.

### Miscellaneous

Ms. Davis spoke. She stated that she has been on this board for 8 years, Chairman for 7, and that she considers this work her volunteer service to her town. The Parking Authority business has substantially increased in the last few years with the amazing resurgence of downtown vitality. She said that it has been a pleasure to contribute to this board and she is proud of their accomplishments. However, due to recent developments, she sadly resigned her post. She expressed her best wishes for future achievements. She also requested that her resignation letter be attached to the minutes.

Ms. Zommer also tendered her written resignation from the Parking Authority. She reassured Ms. Babkirk that she was not a party to this decision. She extended best wishes to all and expressed her pleasure knowing and working with the group.

Mr. Salmeri began by congratulating Ms. Babkirk on her appointment. He stated that there is a lot of work to be done here and he was confident that she was up for the task. He also submitted his written resignation and read it for the group.

Ms. Babkirk asked what the procedure would be to appoint new commissioners and all assured her that the Council and/or the Town Manager would take care of it quite quickly.

Mr. Salmeri addressed the group. He expressed his pleasure in working with them and felt that they have had "a great run" and accomplished much. There is much more to do. He indicated that he was impressed with their ability to act cleverly and cooperatively for the good of the citizens of Southington. He cited the great respect that all members had shown for each others' views without exception; party affiliation never being a consideration. He acknowledged the arduous work of this board, accomplished in a selfless, non-partisan manner and expressed his great honor to have served with them. His resignation is herewith tendered.

Ms. Davis did reassure Ms. Babkirk that she would remain available following her resignation, should she be needed.

### **Adjournment**

Mr. Salmeri made a motion that the meeting be adjourned at 5:10PM, seconded by Ms. Zommer. All were in favor of adjournment.

Dear Gentlemen:

I write this letter with great sadness. As of December 5, 2008 I resign from the Southington Parking Authority.

My resignation comes on the heels of the events that took place in regards to my commissions' requests for the reappointment of Mr. John Myers to the Southington Parking Authority and the method the majority of the Council chose to use not to reappoint him.

I've volunteered for the Town of Southington on the Parking Authority since 2001 and have been the Chairperson since 2002. I've felt proud to tell people when asked why I've been on this commission this long. It's because this is the way I give back to my town. I was told when I was appointed to the Parking Authority, this group is going to very busy in the upcoming years and I can attest we've grown and tackled a large number of parking projects in the last few years. The Parking Authority is unique in the sense that our only motivation is to maintain and regulate the town's municipal parking lots for everyone's use and needs. In all my years the members of the Southington Parking Authority have always acted responsibly and professionally in their duties serving the town. We've never been called to task for not being responsible or professional in our actions.

The Parking Authority is an appointed board not an elected board. In October I realized Mr. Myers, who was appointed by the Town Council in July 2005 to replace Ms. Cocuzza, term was about to end. At this time I emailed the Chairman of the Town Council urging Mr. Myers continuance with the Southington Parking Authority. The email back concerned me so I emailed the attached letter to the Town Councilors – attachment #1 – with the exception of Councilman DePaola who's email doesn't appear on the Town's website. This letter, as you know, contained vital information as to why I requested Mr. Myers continuance with the Parking Authority. I received emails of support back from two councilors. Not only was this my request but also, all of you know, the other commissioners on my board strongly backed the request of the reappointment of Mr. Myers with letters or phone calls. As most of you know we even had a commissioner offer up their spot on the Southington Parking Authority to Mr. Myers should he not be reappointed. That's how important we all felt the projects he was working on were to this town. This was not for any political or personal reasons but for him to be able to continue his volunteer work for the Town of Southington on projects in which he was currently involved and the balance he brought to our commission.

On November 24, 2008 at the Southington Town Council meeting our requests were denied. My resignation is not due to the Council not reappointing Mr. Myers to the Southington Parking Authority but by the method in which its was done.

You, the members of the Southington Town Council can spin this anyway you choose, I understand the Parking Authority's appointments are the Town Manager's appointment based on your suggestions, but the following items are facts.

1. The four commissioners appointments to the Southington Parking Authority since I've been Chairperson happened as follows:
  - a. Ms. Zommer was appointed by the Town Manager at the suggestion of the majority of the Town Council. See attachment #2.
  - b. Mr. Myers was nominated and voted on by the Town Council. See attachment #3.
  - c. Mr. Salmeri was appointed by the Town Manager at the suggestion of the majority of the Town Council. See attachment #4.
  - d. Mrs. Zoni was nominated and voted on by the Town Council. See attachment #5.
2. At the November 24<sup>th</sup> meeting, the Town Manager indicated it was the wish of the majority of the Town Council to appoint Ms. Babkirk to the Southington Parking Authority. This was the only appointment the Council handled this way on November 24<sup>th</sup>. The next six appointments immediately following were motioned and voted on by the Council or tabled. Being mindful it was a Town Manager's appointment fueled by the Town Council's suggestion, the Southington Parking Authority's requests weren't granted or even discussed. When something appears wrong it usually is wrong. Knowing how strongly the entire Parking Authority felt about this appointment why would the Council decide to give their majority "pick" to the Town Manager? Could it be, since it was a 5-4 vote, with Chairman Barry not present at this meeting there would have been a tie and discussion on this appointment?  
Perhaps the discussion would lead to an answer to the Parking Authority's question as to why the Council wouldn't reappoint a volunteer who has proved himself, an outstanding volunteer in many aspects for the Town and a volunteer who was needed on our Board. Was the Town Manager fully informed by the Town Council members (since he abided by the majority of the Town Council's suggestion) as to the Southington Parking Authority's express wishes and reasons for Mr. Myers to continue serving the Town on this board?

For me to stay on this board, would mean I condone the way the Council handled this appointment. As a Chairman I feel the need to lead and speak out on the way this commission has been treated. I wish it were really an appointment but it actually was an action by the majority of the Town Council to not reappoint. The entire commission is left to speculate as to why this happened. This letter needed to be written on the behalf of Mr. Myers and hopefully to have you think about the next time you're faced with a situation surrounding an appointment and the support the entire commission gives an individual who's appointment is ending.

As I've stated in the past, I appreciate the volunteer work all of you do for our Town. I realize you spend countless hours away from your families to serve this Town. This letter is definitely not meant to be disrespectful, but for you to understand the frustration the Parking Authority feels it has been handed due to the actions on this non-reappointment.

I'm sure you'll have no problem filling my seat. However it's not my intention to leave the Town high and dry. I realize you have a short calendar due to the Holiday; I'd be available if called upon, until another member is selected. I'll also hand over the limited information I received when I

became Chairperson to the next Chairperson, as well as any necessary information I've obtained since I've been Chairperson.

In closing I'd like to request two things. The first is the prayer Councilman Secondo read at the November 24<sup>th</sup> meeting be read by each Councilor at the next several meetings. This is an excellent prayer to remind us all what is appropriate in our actions. The second is the most important. Councilman Riccio made an incredible plea to the Council, it was to lead this Town. The plea was for the entire Council to treat each other, all the Town Boards and the public with respect.




