

**TOWN OF SOUTHLINGTON
PARKING AUTHORITY**

A special meeting of the Southington Parking Authority was held on Friday, March 19, 2010 commissioners assembling in the Riccio Way municipal lot. The meeting was called to order by Chairman John J. Solury, Jr., at 3:45PM.

Roll Call

Present were Chairman John J. Solury, Jr., Vice Chairman Dolores Babkirk-Rodrigues and Commissioner Mathew Florian. A quorum was determined. Also present, each of his own volition, Dennis Putala of Apple Valley Landscaping and Frank McKenna of Spruce Hill Nursery.

RICCIO WAY

The boundaries of the town lot were discussed with special attention to where the fence is placed at the rear of the lot.

D'ANGELO/FIRST CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH

It was noted that the curbing at the entrance is in need of repair and the lot needs to be restriped, especially the three handicapped spots near the front of the lot. There was some discussion about whether a more convenient accessible area could be added, or substituted; perhaps an entirely handicapped lot where there a few spaces across the street. Ms. Babkirk-Rodriguez will discuss this with the Congregational Church.

98 MAIN

The lot was found to be in good condition. It is in need of its spring clean up.

AMERICAN LEGION/MASONIC TEMPLE

There was some pooling of water noted near the exit to Apple Alley. The lot appears, otherwise, in good condition. It just needs to be swept. Chairman Solury will consult the highway department to see if they could take care of this.

BANK OF AMERICA

It was noted that there is a two-hour parking sign missing and another in disrepair. The signage committee of the Parking Authority is aware of this and plans are in the works to take care of it, now that the weather allows. There was some discussion about adding islands, their placement, and the use of more prominent signs.

POPULAR

Found in good condition. Needs to be cleaned up for spring.

NORTH LIBERTY

The dumpster situation was discussed. The signage was an issue. There is a huge sign outlining municipal lot rules and

Mrs. Babkirk-Rodriguez had questions about whether it was necessary. The sign denoting public parking is obscured by plantings. Mrs. Babkirk-Rodriguez suggested that a simple large red P could work. No winter damage was noted.

PAUL GREGORY

The commissioners assessed the parking lot, although it is not slated to become an official municipal lot for another year, at least. Dumpster position was discussed. Commissioners are anxious to offer this additional parking to Southington.

PLANTSVILLE

Not visited.

QUINNIPIAC

Not visited.
