NOTES: 1. An approval of a special permit only becomes effective after proper notice has been published and the applicant has filed a copy of his/her approval letter with the Town Clerk on the Land Records (Sect. 8-3c of the Connecticut General Statutes). 2. The applicant must submit a stamped copy (by the Clerk) of the submittal to the clerk which notes the volume and page number in the land records when applying for a subsequent permit or a zoning permit. 3. An approved Special Permit Use not put into effect within one year becomes null and void. A single one-year extension may be granted before the approval first anniversary date (Sect. 8-03.3 of the Zoning Regulations).
