I noticed there is an agenda item for the site plan for this location at your next meeting. After reviewing all the linked documentation, I don't see that truck traffic is being addressed, hopefully it will be?

As part of this application approval, can you pursue restricting truck traffic from this location to enter and exit to North Main Street and if the new road exits to Lazy Lane, restrict truck traffic to enter and exit to Queen Street and include appropriate signage.
